AETS: Natural Resources Training to Employment

This program may be for you if you want a change in your career.

There are many different opportunities regarding this program. The options of employment possibilities are:

A-Z truck Driving Course - 5 weeks



Aboriginal Hospitality and Tourism – 4 weeks with the addition of 2 of these modules –



1. Food and lodging Assistant – 4 weeks
2. Cook – 4 weeks
3. Grounds maintenance – 4 weeks

4. Dock hand – 4 weeks

5. Fishing and hunting Guide – 4 weeks

6. Fur Harvesting

Business management & Entrepreneurship – 4 weeks

Must complete sawmill worker course to apply for forest inventory management training.

There is a Foundation training that will be taking place in Thunder Bay on November 22, 2011. Destination will be posted and you will be contacted asap.

In order to start the process to attend the program, each individual is to do an assessment. The assessment is a test to see where you are in your English and math.

Towes is another test you will do to see where you would fit in the working field. You can do your assessment at the Labour Centre school (or confederation college) contact Sue/Relita at 473-3851 or Dorothy at 875-2785. The assessment and towes usually takes a day and a half.

Once you are finished the Towes test it goes to the college for marking. Next step is to attend the Foundation Training. **Thunder Bay training- November 22, 2011.**

Once you are done the foundation training, you will then jump into the program of your choice. This will be roughly up to 12 weeks.

Once you complete the above you will then go on the job training.

Last but not least Graduation and Job search!!

Notes;

- Assessments (Math, English, TOWES) must be done following client registration – **call Anthony at AETS – 346-0307**
- Foundation training is located in the community with the most interested members or communities with 10 or more interested members
- The Sector Training follows shortly after the foundation training
 - On-site training follows Sector training however depends on availability of sector site
- Upon completion of a course, a ceremony is held and a job search shortly after unless the member wants to continue with training in another sector.
 - The member does not have to go through another foundation training course but rather straight into an available sector training course
- Allowance is not facilitated through AETS; it is allocated through the support from the community
- All testing, assessments and training programs are administered through Confederation College
