AZA Environmental Technician

The Environmental Technician will be responsible for on-site environmental monitoring and oversight on behalf of Animbiigoo Zaagi'igan Anishinaabek for the Greenstone Gold Mines (GGM) Hardrock Project. The primary role for the Environmental Technicians will be involvement in environmental data collection and sampling throughout the life of the mine to ensure compliance and environmental protection. The Environment Technician will also be responsible for collecting and documenting environmental concerns from community members. The Environmental Technician will be required to keep the community informed about environmental monitoring at the mine site, they will be required to plan community meetings related to environmental matters. The Environmental Technician will sit on the Environmental Advisory Subcommittee for the Project and liaise with AZA's technical experts.

The Environmental Technicians will be responsible for the following:

- Monitor (visually and/or with sampling equipment) Project activities occurring onsite to ensure compliance with internal GGM Environmental Management and Monitoring Plans, and regulatory environmental requirements
- Participate in GGM environmental monitoring activities such as:
 - Collecting samples (e.g., air, water, vegetation and soil samples)
 - Fish and wildlife surveys
 - Regulatory compliance (e.g., equipment inspections, water extraction/handling, soil handling, fuel spill management, waste management, wildlife management, etc.)
 - o undertake sample preparation and packaging for lab analysis
 - $\circ \quad$ enter data and manage records from sampling and other field work
- Monitor for cultural heritage resources during construction and for archaeological field studies
- Safely and effectively use GGM vehicles (including all-terrain vehicles and boats) to access required areas to conduct the duties outlined above
- Report any environmental or emergencies to GGM site supervisor and Chief and Council
- Participate in Environmental Advisory Subcommittee
- Review environmental permits, monitoring plans and reports
- Facilitate engagement sessions with AZA Members to inform and gather feedback, concerns and questions from Members regarding the effects of the Project on the Environment and Rights and Values
- Report First Nation Member concerns, questions and ideas regarding Project effects on the Environment and Rights and Values to the Environment Advisory Subcommittee
- Schedule site tours for staff and interested community members as an educational tool and to better comprehend the project footprint
- Other tasks as reasonably assigned by the First Nation.





Training Provisions and Needs:

AZA and GGM are willing to provide training to interested applicants.

- Basic first aid
- One week of basic environmental monitoring training provided by GGMs environmental consultant
- On-site training with environmental professionals
- Other training deemed by GGM to be relevant and necessary for Environmental Technicians to carry out their work

Desired Skills

- Knowledge or interest in environmental studies or science
- Excellent verbal communications skills
- Excellent writing skills (email, reporting, etc)
- Good organizational and problem-solving skills
- Demonstrated ability to work independently, and as part of a team
- Proficiency with Microsoft PowerPoint, Excel, Word and Outlook
- Willingness to work outdoors when conducting field work in potentially adverse conditions (rain, bugs, heat)
- AZA member
- Ability to travel to the GGM mine site
- Valid G licence
- Desire to learn about and protect the environment

Asset Skills

- Past experience in environmental field
- Past experience with field work and surveying
- Speak Ojibway
- First Aid certification

Work Requirements

The Environmental Technician position is a full-time position with 4 days per week spent at the mine site and 1 day per week in the community. Note, there is the potential for evening or weekend work during increased monitoring periods and emergency situations.





Supervision

The Environmental Technician will report directly to the Animbiigoo Zaagi'igan Anishinaabek Development Manager, Joe Donio. While on the GGM Hardrock Project site or observing / participating in on-site, local or regional environmental monitoring work, the Environmental Technician will liaise with directly with Greenstone Gold Mines' Environmental Supervisor or their designates from GGM.
